Who is My Neighbor?

Jesus was no stranger to challenges or tough questions, so when an expert in the Law asks about eternal life, Jesus is not caught off guard. Like many other great teachers, Je-



sus turns the question back to the questioner; "What is written in the Law? How do you read it?" (Luke 10:26), Jesus asks. The man's response (Love God and love others, succinctly) warrants a gold star, correct answer from Jesus. However, the expert is not willing to merely stop there; he asks one more probing question, "And who is my neighbor?" (Luke 10:29) This simple question launches Jesus into a story that is all too familiar for us as 21st Century Christians, the Good Samaritan-a phrase which is so prevalent in our society that even those who have never set foot in a church or opened a Bible have heard this phrase. Yet, I want to ask you as you journey with me today, to set aside all prior ideas and thoughts concerning this story of Jesus and to look at it with fresh eyes. Let's begin.

One brief note about the relationship between Jews and Samaritans: the Jews and the Samaritans did not get along; the Jews had such a disdain for the Samaritans that they would not even associate with them at all! Anyway, so there is a Jewish traveler who is attacked by robbers and left on the road, basically to die. Now it just so happens that a priest comes by that same road-this is wonderful news for the man! Surely, this priest, a man of God, will see the traveler and provide assistance. However, Jesus tells us that the priest saw the man and passed on the other side-any number of reasons could have precluded the priest from helping: he was late, the traveler (being covered in blood) was unclean, the priest was nervous for his own life. Jesus doesn't tell us the priest's reasoning, but don't miss that Jesus makes sure that we know that it was an intentional avoidance and not an accident. The priest is followed by a Levite, another man of God, who acts in the same manner.

Now let me say this: be sure that if we were to retell this story in our era, these individuals would be us-the every day Christian, the every man or woman. And perhaps you are saying, "Well it wouldn't be me. I would never just walk by if saw someone in need of help." I think all of us would like to think that; that when we are in that moment of truth, we will rise to the challenge and do what is right. But what if I told you, we have those moments of truth EVERY day and that you and I are failing EVERY day. We may not be passing bruised and bloody travelers on the side of the road, but we are driving by homes of people who are hurting and crying out for help. We are missing the hurt and pain that is all around us, even within the walls of our church. There are lots of things vying for our attention and perhaps we need to take a step back and reevaluate our individual priorities-is it so important to be "on time" that we leave a man to die on the road? I think it is time that we not only ask, 'Who is my neighbor?', but also, 'How am I treating my neighbor?" Both answers lie in the Samaritan's treatment of the man and Jesus' simple instruction, "Go and do likewise. " (Luke 10:37)
